Cuts from Ferns	Lacerations to hands	M	M	4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Instructor to inform group of consequences of pulling on ferns.</li> <li>▪ Ensure that cutting of ferns is by knife by the Instructor.</li> </ul>
Ticks	Ticks attaching to the skin. Risk of Lyme disease.	L	M	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Warn group about presence of ticks and methods of prevention.</li> <li>▪ Inform group that if they have irritation in warm body areas (armpit or crotch) then check for ticks.</li> <li>▪ Tick can be removed with tweezers on it's head and slowly pulled out.</li> <li>▪ Cotton can be used tied as close to head as possible and then slowly pulling.</li> </ul>
Boats causing damage during transportation	Severe physical injury, Death,	L	H	5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Trailer and roof racks to be suitable and sound for transportation of boats.</li> <li>▪ All equipment to be adequately secured.</li> <li>▪ Trailer to have working, adequate 'tail light board' fitted.</li> </ul>
Further risks	Physical injury	M	L	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ All risks should be minimised by continual appraisal of participants condition, the environment and equipment through dynamic risk assessment by the staff members involved.</li> <li>▪ Some risks still remain but every care must be taken to minimise these.</li> </ul>
